The Liberty girls took the top five spots in the 100m dash and also had a collective of 13 personal records. Sophia Sampson led Liberty with a time of 12.50 and Lillian Sylvia led Jerome in with a time of 13.84. Liberty's Sampson, Kennedy Elfers, and Natalie Nichols took the top three spots in the 200m dash and the team also had 12 more personal records. Jerome's Ava Watson won the 400m dash with a personal record of 1:00.10 and Liberty's Nichols came in second with another personal record time of 1:01.94. There were 15 Liberty personal records in the girls 400. In the girls 800m run Liberty Freshman Bridget Snider came in first with a person record by 10 seconds of 2:21.68. Jerome's Abbie McBrearty had a personal record of 2:26.57 finishing in second place. Freshman Becca Henry got a personal record in the 1600m run of 5:47.24 scoring second place for Liberty. Julia Bockenstette got a personal record of 11:33.77 in the 3200m

run, winning first place for Liberty. Liberty's Maria Stack won second place in the 100m hurdles and first place in the 300m hurdles, getting a personal record in both races. Liberty girls also won the 4x100m relay and 4x800m relay.
